7. I have **just / already** received their reply.
8. Have you started working on that project **yet**?
9. I have **already / just** started working on that project. (Note that the meaning changes when we replace already with just.)
10. We have **yet** to hear from them.
11. We haven't heard from them **yet**.
12. She hasn't returned from work **yet**.
